Hello Friends,

We are honored to launch our touring roster for the 25 - 26 season. Every year, we work collaboratively with our artistic partners, both new and returning, as they consider what to offer in the year ahead. We look closely at budgets, scale, age recommendations, and production needs, but we also talk about the moments that brought us joy and inspiration, fed our curiosity, and gave us new insights. We think about the experience for the audience. Assembling a roster is much like putting together a season. A balancing act. One that requires research and strategy but also faith and gumption.

We seek to represent performances that are fulfilling on many levels and bring artistic excellence together with educational and community values. We're proud of this year's offerings and are so excited to talk and plan with you.

We have fantastic literature-based productions such as the music-filled Hare & Tortoise from tutti frutti which celebrates moving at your own pace, and the new Wind In the Willows from Theatre Heroes which brings the classic story to life with stunning projected illustrations. For teens and general audiences, we have the return of the beloved Nearly Lear from Susanna Hamnett that takes on King Lear through the eyes of the fool.

We also have productions that embrace science and technology, perfect for STEAM learning goals or any audience member who wants to explore the world around them. Musician Kaki King and video artists GLITCH dive into the world of **Bugs** with state of the art video mapping and original music. **Moss Piglet** from Windmill Theater Co. features tardigrades, real life microscopic action heroes, as they survive in a changing world. And **Secrets of Space** from Cahoots NI follows two sisters as they consider the great mystery of outer space as well as major scientific discoveries from the perspective of two sisters.

Many of our productions celebrate specific cultures, from Honolulu Theater for Youth's **The Great Race**, which tells the story of the Chinese Zodiac, to **La Maleta de Maebelle (Maebelle's Suitcase)** from Glass Half Full where Maebelle helps a bird return to Columbia, their mutual birthplace.

GRAMMY Winning 123 Andrés' bilingual concerts celebrates community and kindness. Talking Birds and Golden Fish from David Gonzalez unites animal tales from around the world for a global storytelling concert.

We know that attending performance arts events is a powerful experience for the whole family and our artists excel in performing for all ages. We have GRAMMY Nominee **Uncle Jumbo** who shares messages of positivity and love set to a hip hop beat. Brush Theatre's **Doodle POP** returns to dazzle families with mischievous drawings that take on a life of their own. **Being Beethoven** from CDP serves as an extraordinary introduction to the classical canon. And in **Monkeys Everywhere**, the struggle to concentrate erupts into pure silliness as the audience becomes the monkeys in Garry Starr's mind.

There is so much joy in these productions. But these are meaningful journeys too. The characters at the center of these stories have big questions about themselves and about the world, often with difficult choices to make. In **Finding North** from David Gonzalez, John P. Parker puts his own safety at risk in order to help free enslaved people. In **Maddi's Fridge** from Childsplay, Sophie must decide if helping her friend is worth breaking a promise. In **Hero: The Boy From Troy** from Nambi E. Kelley and First Woman, young John Lewis must figure out what to do with his anger at the injustice in the world - how to make good trouble.

Each year is full of unknowns. Each year is full of opportunities and challenges. But what we do know is that these stories and experiences matter. This audience matters. The work we do together, on stage and off, matters to our communities and to the world.

We are grateful to represent this diverse group of artists and productions. Whether this is your 41st year working with Holden & Arts Associates or your very first, we want to hear from you.

Some people call them 'Water Bears', and others call them 'Moss Piglets'. Taking audiences from the jelly-filled petri dishes of scientific labs to bustling suburban garden beds and icy Arctic glaciers, Moss Piglet is an explosive portrait of the world's most resilient and curious critters. Playful and thrilling, Moss Piglet is an epic new work utilizing puppetry, green screens, dance and scientific research that show even the tiniest of things can be part of a giant adventure. A mischievous duo starts to doodle... and ends up creating a whole imaginative world! They invite us along on their sea adventure with a tiny little turtle. What will happen as we follow their vivid drawings into this beautiful watery world, and will they return the turtle to the sea safely?

This touching and exciting show uses a live score and sound effects, stunning interactive animation, and an abundance of theatrical imagination.

A fun exploration of bugs, beetles, critters, and all things sugar. Experience Kaki King's signature guitar music, projection mapping and drum-triggered effects, as well as audio samples and multiple kinds of insect sounds.

This interactive performance encourages audiences to participate and dance along. They will be invited to shout out to their favorite bug, dance like one of the insects jiggling around on the guitar, and embrace their curiosity about the world around us.

Andrés and Christina are 123 Andrés! This GRAMMY & Latin Grammy Awardwinning music duo are available for family concerts, student matinees, and community residency. These highenergy, joyful shows include hits from 123 Andrés' award-winning albums and incorporate Spanish, English, and ASL languages. Student matinees introduce musical styles and instruments along with geography and social studies connections. And they have multiple bilingual books based on their songs, published by Scholastic. Their catchy music and lively performances get the whole audience dancing, singing, and learning!



Which animals win the race? What are the traits that help them cross the river? Why do the Rat and Cat become enemies? This performance features a cast of four, traditional Chinese music, Jingju and martial arts movement, and a whole lot of fun!

Watch with delight as two actor/musicians introduce families and young audiences to the life and work of Ludwig van Beethoven, in this fun new production from the same company that toured Meeting Mozart worldwide. Audiences will learn about Beethoven's personal resilience and creativity, classical musical history including key women composers of the 1800s, and the themes behind some of Beethoven's most famous music (Ode to Joy, his Symphony no 3, and many more), meeting all the instruments in the ensemble along the way. Premieres Fall 2024!

This production requires collaboration with a local string quintet, which can be integrated into the performance in a rehearsal with the company that can coincide with the load-in. This is a perfect residency opportunity to engage high school, college, or local community musicians. The production can also work with local professionals with less advance rehearsal required.

He's trying to carry too much on his flight south for the winter! When Maebelle generously offers her cherished suitcase from her own migration from Colombia, they delve into the beauty of remembrance and the liberating power of letting go. This performance celebrates friendship, cultural heritage, and the universal lessons found within the stories of our lives. Featuring a two-person cast, various styles of puppetry, environmental themes, & Colombian music.



Monkeys Everywhere is a show for everyone – but especially for those who can't always keep their monkeys under control. Full of clowning, audience interaction, and a lot of laughter, it would be bananas to miss it! This new production will premiere at the Edinburgh Fringe in August 2024.

Maddi and Sofia are best friends. They play in their neighborhood park together. Maddi is really good at climbing the rock wall, while Sofia is a fast runner. One day Sofia discovers that Maddi has no food in her fridge at home. Sofia wants to help her friend, but Maddi makes her promise not to tell anyone. What should Sofia do? Based on the book by Lois Brandt, this play is a thoughtful and funny exploration of friendship, empathy, and doing the right thing.







Together we go on a musical journey through the decades that shows how the heroes in the Civil Rights movement inspired John Lewis to protest injustice and get into 'good trouble.' As young John meets Rosa Parks and Dr. King and ultimately becomes a leader and American hero himself, Jayden learns how he too can take a stand. This one-man play brings to life the powerful stories of the strivings, sacrifices and dreams of John P. Parker, a former enslaved man who dedicated his life to helping other enslaved people escape through the Underground Railroad. Drawn from historical research, Parker's tale is woven together with interviews from contemporary immigrants who tell their stories of searching for haven in modernday America. This production is both an exploration and celebration of the continuing quest for justice and freedom in America.

What if the great and tragic story of King Lear were to be told through the eyes of his closest companion?
